INTERPOL

INTERPOL exists as a catalyst to provide efficient police communications between the United States and 126 other member countries and the General Secretariat Headquarters. The INTERPOL function in all countries is carried out to facilitate police matters that cut across international jurisdictions. In each member country, a point of contact and coordination known as the National Central Bureau (NCB) is established for the INTERPOL In the United States, authority for the INTERPOL function rests, by law, with the Attorney General. The Washington NCB is located in the main Justice building. The United States NCB coordinates and facilitates requests between foreign police organizations and law enforcement agencies for information regarding persons, vehicles, and goods that bear on criminal matters with those respective jurisdictions. The countries which exist in the INTERPOL network through their respective NCB, utilize the support of a permanent administrative and technical organ known as The General Secretariat, currently located in St. Cloud, a suburb of Paris, France. The United States pays about 5.2% of the General Secretariat budget.
