	Child Pornography Victim Assistance (CPVA) Program Database Within the FBI, the Office of Victim Assistance (OVA) coordinates the CPVA program CPVA maintains a tracking system containing the names, contact information, and notification preferences of identified Child Pornography (CP) victims The information collected and maintained in this tracking system is from investigations conducted by international, federal, state, or local agencies This information is shared among federal agencies to prevent repeated and unwanted notices to victims in an attempt to mitigate trauma			

Child Pornography Victim Assistance (CPVA) Program Database

The CPVA program is a joint initiative between the Federal Bureau of Investigations, United States Postal Inspection Service (USPIS), Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), United States Attorney Office (USAO), Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section (CEOS), and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) The main purpose of the program is to streamline the notification process for victims of child pornography. This joint effort seeks to minimize the number of redundant contacts by the various agencies and centralize the notification process mandated by law

Within the FBI, the Office of Victim Assistance (OVA) coordinates the CPVA program—CPVA maintains a tracking system containing the names, contact information, and notification preferences of identified Child Pornography (CP) victims—The information collected and maintained in this tracking system is from investigations conducted by international, federal, state, or local agencies. This information is shared among federal agencies to prevent repeated and unwanted notices to victims in an attempt to mitigate trauma—CPVA contains limited victim biographical data including name, address, race, and date of birth (DOB), contact information for a parent or legal guardian of a minor victim, point of contact information for the agency that has previously conducted an investigation based on images of the same victim and the victim's preference to receive notice of additional investigations or prosecutions, or to submit a Victim Impact Statement (VIS)—If a victim has not previously waived that right, he/she will continue to be notified whenever the victim's image appears in any subsequent investigation—CP victims who have previously opted out of notice and VIS rights and wish to change their mind may do so by contacting OVA, the local FBI Victim Specialist, or the local US Attorney's Office

Victim information is ultimately placed in the CPVA database when an international, federal, state, or local agency recovers pornographic images depicting indentified CP victims and submits the images to NCMEC

1 Inputs

a When new identified victims/series are submitted to NCMEC by an international, federal, state, or local LE agency, NCMEC notifies OVA OVA requests the investigating agency obtain notification preference information from the victim(s) to obtain the information needed to complete the OVA Notification Preference Form After the form is signed by the victim (and/or parent or guardian, if appropriate), it is forwarded to the OVA where the victim's information and preferences are entered into the CPVA database ¹

DISPOSITION: TEMPORARY The Notification Preference Forms will be destroyed 75 years after receipt

b On a quarterly basis, NCMEC provides OVA with a cumulative listing of all named series associated to known victims submitted by both federal and non-federal agencies, along with an agency point of contact.

DISPOSITION TEMPORARY NCMEC listings can be deleted/destroyed once input in CPVA is verified as accurate and complete, or when superseded, whichever is later.

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¹ The OVA's Notification Preference Form is available for use by other federal agencies, but the investigating agency is free to collect and forward victim information and preferences to OVA in any manner they choose
