Enclosures, attachments, and exhibits to case files maintained at Federal Bureau of Investigation Headquarters, which are determined to possess no administrative value and the disposal of which would not impair or deter future operations. The contents date from the early 20th century and include literature, original evidence, photographs, latent fingerprints, and other miscellaneous items which will be judged on individual worth.  Destroy when 20 years old or when administrative needs have been met, whichever is earlier.		
2.	Books, political pamphlets, propaganda leaflets, and intelligence reports received from sources outside the agency, incorporated into the Federal Bureau of Investigation classified central file, and used as reference sources for study of foreign and domestic propaganda, travel, and political activities. Material dates from the late 19th century and no longer serves a reference purpose. Originals should be available from outside sources.  Destroy when 20 years old or when administrative needs have been met, whichever is earlier.
