Approximately 2,800 of the former and 500 of the latter have accumulated since their respective inceptions in January, 1967, and November, 1971. In addition to the storage problems and the cost involved in purchasing replacement tapes, it has been determined that the proposed retention period is adequate for current and future Bureau needs.
