The Office of Justice Programs (OJP) provides innovative leadership to Federal, state, local and tribal justice systems, by disseminating state-of-the-art knowledge and practices across America, and providing tools for the implementation of these crime fighting strategies. Because most of the responsibility for crime control and prevention falls to law enforcement officers in states, cities, and neighborhoods, the Federal government can be effective in these areas only to the extent that it provide the necessary tools, in the prevention of lose of life to its officers that serve and protect the citizens of this Nation

On June 16, 1998, the Bulletproof Vest Partnership (BVP) Grant Act of 1998 was signed as law (Public Law 105-181). The purpose of the Act is to save the lives of law enforcement officers by helping States and units of local government and tribal governments equip their law enforcement officers with armor vests.

The Bulletproof Vest Partnership system was created to support the BVP program and make it possible to provide the funds for up to 50% the cost of an armor vest to state, local and tribal governments.

## 1 Inputs

The primary source of input for the BVP system is the manual input by the external users (state and local governments) when they apply for BVP funding.

Changes made to the system follow OCIO's change management process. The system has database backups performed on it using data managements backup process.

### Other System-to-system information exchanges

- This system interfaces with FMIS2, a financial system in JMD, through flat files it feeds to FMIS2.

The external BVP user is able to login to the BVP system to check their application status, apply for funds or make draw-down requests on available funds.

## 2. Master File

The information which BVP collects may include the jurisdiction name, agency ID, address, point of contact, and the names of both the Chief Executive Officer and Chief Financial Officer, as well as the jurisdiction population, FMIS Vendor number (used to make payments), Vest Replacement Cycle, jurisdiction DUNs number (if available), total number of law enforcement professionals, initial registration date and participating law enforcement agencies in the jurisdiction. Additionally, the BVP collects the application year, award number, application id, BVP submission date, award release date, total proposed amount, estimated BVP portion of total costs, funding percentage, number of vests, unit price, tax/shipping and handling costs, vest model and vest manufacturer.

DISPOSITION: PERMANENT - The system stores the information in a database for an indefinite amount of time.

## 3. Outputs

The flat files sent to FMIS2 are the only output of the system.

Up to one application can be associated with each program year for a unique vendor.
