The Office of Justice Programs (OJP) provides innovative leadership to Federal, state, local and tribal justice systems, by disseminating state-of-the-art knowledge and practices across America, and providing tools for the implementation of these crime fighting strategies. Because most of the responsibility for crime control and prevention falls to law enforcement officers in states, cities, and neighborhoods, the Federal government can be effective in these areas only to the extent that it provide the necessary tools, to prosecute criminal cases

The Southwest Border Prosecution Initiative (SWBPI) provides funds to eligible jurisdictions in the four southwest border states, using a uniform payment-per-case basis for qualifying federally initiated and declined-referred criminal cases. Eligible jurisdictions include the county governments and the four state governments in Arizona, California, New Mexico, and Texas

The SWBPI system was created to support the SWBPI program and make it possible to reimburse the southwest border jurisdictions for costs associated with prosecuting federally declined criminal cases as required in Public Law 103-22

1 Inputs

The source of input for the SWBPI system is the manual input by the external users (state and local governments) when they apply for SWBPI funding

Other System-to-system information exchanges

- This system interfaces with FMIS2, a financial system in JMD, through flat files it feeds to FMIS2
- Changes made to the system follow OCIO's change management process. The system has database backups performed on it using data managements backup process
- The system uses T2000 from Sun Microsystems

Users

The external SWBPI user is able to login to the SWBPI system to check their application status, apply for funds or make drawdown requests on available funds. Also, the quarterly award amounts for each agency are posted on the SWBPI website.

The information which SWBPI collects may include Jurisdiction Name, Agency ID, Address, POC, Chief Executive Officer, Chief Financial Officer, FMIS Vendor number (used to make payments), application year, application number, application status, award amount, total application value, prosecutors on staff, prosecutor salary, hourly rate, detention per diem rate, date paid, arresting federal agency, docket number, defendant name, federal declined date, resolved date, resolution, hours spent on case, inmate ID, docket number, inmate name, detained date, released date, and detention days

Disposition PERMANENT The system stores the information in a database for an indefinite amount of time

3 Output

The flat files sent to FMIS2 are the only output of the system
