The Wage and Hour Division is headed by an Administrator who reports directly to the Deputy Under Secretary for Employment Standards.

C. Files consist of correspondence, reports, dockets, comments and transcripts relating to the hearings held in 1974 which resulted in new 29 CFR Part 553 being published in the Federal Register on December 20, 1974, concerning the application of section 7(k) and 13(b)(20) of the Fair Labor Standards Act to Federal fire fighters and law enforcement personnel.
