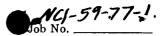

The records described in Item 1a below are proposed for disposal after microfilming. These records have a retention period of more than 10 years. They will be filmed, used and stored in accordance with the procedures outlined in FPMR 101-11.504, 101-11.505 and 101-11.506. The records described in item 3 are also proposed for disposal after microfilming. These records have a retention period of more than 10 years however the microfilm process we propose to use does not meet the requirements of FPMR 101-11.504. We plan to use an add-on (updateable) technique which uses a specially coated film for producing microfiche. The film is based on a transparent electrophotographic process using a photo-conductor. Images produced are formed by depositing and fixing carbon particles onto a polyester film base. We plan periodic inspection of the microfiche and should any deterioration occur we will make a duplicate fiche using safety-base permanent record film as specified in American National Standards Institute PH 1.25, 1.28, 1.29 and 1.31 and with Federal Standard 125a.
