4400 - Office of Native Hawaiian Relations (ONHR)

The Office of Native Hawaiian Relations was authorized by Congress in Public Law 108-199 on January 23, 2004, and in Public Law 104-42 on November 2, 1995. The office discharges the Secretary's responsibilities for matters related to Native Hawaiians and serves as a conduit for the Department's field activities in Hawaii.

4401 - Oversight Case Files. ONHR is responsible for the oversight and review of Land Exchanges, as outlined by 43 CFR Part 31 and the Hawaiian Homelands Recovery Act (HHRLA) of 1995. Land Exchange oversight is done in coordination with the Department of Hawaiian Homelands and regards the exchange of Native Hawaiian lands for other land parcels. ONHR also oversees amendments proposed to the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act (HHCA), as required by section 4 of the Hawaii Statehood Admissions Act, 73 Stat. 4. The HHLRA provides that the Department is to review State enactments proposing to amend the HHCA to determine whether congressional consent is required under section 4 of the Hawaii Statehood Admissions Act.

Records include but are not limited to: correspondence, land evaluations, exchange proposal agreements, notices of decision, NEPA review files, consultation meeting files, draft bills, comments, and supporting documents.

Disposition: <u>Permanent</u>. Cut off when case is closed. Transfer to NARA 3 years after cut-off.
