TREASURY DEPARTMENT ORDER NO. 202-2

Disestablishment of the Office of Domestic Gold and Silver Operations

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Secretary of the Treasury, including the authority in Reorganization Plan No. 26 of 1950, and due to the termination of gold licensing requirements by P.L. 93-373, it is hereby directed that, effective July 31, 1975--

- 1. The Office of Domestic Gold and Silver Operations is disestablished and its functions terminated, with the exception of the following functions which are transferred to the Assistant Secretary (International Affairs) for assignment within his Office as he shall designate:
 - a. providing statistical data on the private gold market for use by the Department of the Treasury;
 - b. maintaining continuing assessment of the state of the gold market, including direct contact with major dealers and users;
 - c. maintaining liaison with the staffs of other agencies concerned with the gold market; and
 - d. supervising the conduct of Treasury operations and procedures required by Parts 81 and 93 of the Code of Federal Regulations.
- 2. All references in Parts 81 and 93 of the Code of Federal Regulations to the Office of Domestic Gold and Silver Operations shall for procedural purposes be deemed to refer henceforth to the Assistant Secretary (International Affairs).
- 3. The position of Director, Office of Domestic Gold and Silver Operations, and all Office positions vacant as of July 31, 1975, are abolished.
- 4. All remaining Office positions occupied as of July 31, 1975, and their incumbents are transferred to the Office of the Assistant Secretary (International Affairs).

Treasury Department Order No. 193 (October 9, 1961), Treasury Department Order No. 193-1, Revision 2 (October 26, 1967), and Treasury Department Order No. 193-2 (February 15, 1965) are hereby rescinded.
