## **Purpose of the System:**

The Problem Driver Pointer System consists of identification data for problem drivers provided by all 51 U S jurisdictions. It serves as a centralized database system that is used to search individual motorists' records. The PDPS supports NHTSA's mission of reducing the personal and economic toll of traffic crashes by providing a nationwide clearinghouse of individuals whose driving privileges have been revoked, suspended or cancelled or who have been convicted of a motor vehicle-related offense, such as driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs. State agencies that issue driver licenses request information from the system prior to issuing licenses. Federal agencies with safety related responsibilities, such as the Federal Aviation Administration, request information when making certification decisions. Federal agencies that perform personnel security investigations also have access to the system.

**Note:** Electronic records are disposed of in accordance with DOT Record Schedules and/or the appropriate NARA General Records Schedules
