MARYLAND STATE ACCIDENT DATA. One of a collection of 27 states police reported accident data. Each
state provides a census of all police accident reports, annually. The State Data are used to support National
Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) identification of traffic safety problems, development and
implementation of vehicle and driver countermeasures, and evaluation of motor vehicle safety standards.

State police, local police, sheriffs and other enforcement officers in Maryland fill out a Police Accident Report (PAR) for each motor vehicle accident resulting in at one vehicle towed from the scene, a personal injury, or a fatality. They record environmental and road conditions and accident, vehicle, and occupant characteristics. NHTSA obtains the data from the Maryland State Police.

YEARS AVAILABLE: 1977-1991, 1993 & thereafter.

ARRANGEMENT STATEMENT: No special arrangement.

STATEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS: There are no restrictions.
