Retire to the Washington National Records Center (WNRC) after 3 years. After 7 years, destroy at WNRC. The overall retention for the records is 10 years.</p>		
1b.	<p>The Medical Inspector Site Visit Reports consist of site visit reports and other record documents related to site visits.</p> <p><u>Disposition.</u> Temporary. Retire to WNRC after 10 years. After 10 years, destroy at WNRC. The overall retention for the records is 20 years.</p> <p>Pursuant to 38 U.S.C. 5705 (Medical Quality Assurance Record Confidentiality), and its implementing regulations, each agency record that is protected by 38 U.S.C. 5705, is accepted by the Archivist of the United States for storage, processing, and servicing, shall be considered to be maintained by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and subject to the provisions of Title 38. The Archivist of the United States shall not disclose the records except to VA, or under the rules established by VA.</p>
