<p>The Veterans Health Administration (VHA) of the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) provides health care services to the Nation's veterans and their dependents. As a component of the health care treatment process, the Chaplain Service of VHA provides religious support to veterans and their families.</p> <p>The data base is maintained on micro-computers by the National Chaplain Service which is located at the Hampton VA Medical Center, Virginia. The system has been developed in a Massachusetts General Hospital Utility Multi-Programming System (MUMPS) FileMan data structure and is not connected with VA's Decentralized Hospital Computer Program (DHCP) or Information Systems Center (ISC). Data are entered, retrieved, and used by means of VA's communication network, VA Data Transmission System/Integrated Data Communication Utility (VADATS/IDCU). Record information generated from the data base is administrative in nature and is used to facilitate and to implement programs in Total</p> <p><i>Copies sent to Agency NFE NNTNSX 6/14/95</i></p>			

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	<p>Quality Improvement.</p> <p>The data base consists of personal information of VA chaplains, other Chaplain Service staff, applicants for chaplain positions, and selected providers of services to the VA chaplaincy. Data collected include name, date of birth, Social Security Number, educational qualifications including continuing educational data, membership in religious bodies and related religious experience, employment history relevant to chaplaincy, name, locations and dates of significant professional events, psychological and related survey data relevant to personal and professional development and research in the Chaplain Service, data to verify and validate the effectiveness of affirmative action programs, work-related performance data, and performance data appropriate for national aggregation and management applications. Data are also maintained on resource providers who assist in the work of the chaplaincy; names of consultants and providers, their organization, types of services provided, effectiveness and performance on contracts, special characteristics related to nature of their service, and nature of correspondence and related administrative matters.</p> <p>Users must have access and verify codes maintained by the National Chaplain Service. Users of codes are required to adhere to strict security Procedures associated with VA-wide use of VADATS, IDCU and DHCP systems. All staff access to the system data is restricted to only that data required on a need-to-know basis per routine performance of their duties. Computers are maintained in a secure environment in the main computer room of the medical center. An automatic feature provides constant backup of the database on a second disk drive. In addition, overnight backup of system data to tape is standard Information Resource Management (IRM) procedure.</p> <p>Privacy Act System Notice 84VA11K provides routine uses for disclosure of Information from the subject records.</p> <p>National Chaplain Management Information System Records</p> <p>Electronic files and records used to create and update data information pertaining to the National Chaplain Management Information System.</p>
