This request for records disposition authority covers all records of the National Railroad The NRAB was created in 1934 Adjustment Board. by Amendments to the Railway Labor Act of 1926. The Board replaced the Regional Train Service Boards of Adjustment which had functioned since their establishment under the Transportation Act of 1926. The NRAB was established to adjudicate disputes between carriers and their employees resulting from grievances on the interpretation or application of agreements which could not be settled in the required conferences. The NRAB operates under the National Mediation Board, although except for budgetary and general administrative direction it acts as a separate entity. The National Railroad Adjustment Board is divided into four Divisions, consisting of equal numbers of representatives of the carriers and of national organizations of employees. Each Division has jurisdiction over certain crafts or classes of employees. The Divisions have always operated as distinct units with their own policies and
