The National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) conducts representation elections in which employees cast secret ballots to determine whether or not they wish to be represented by a union in dealing with their employers, and if so, which union shall represent them. On February 16, 1967, Leonard Scheno, a machinist working in the Reynolds Metals Company aluminum can manufacturing plant in Woodbridge, NJ, became the 25,000,000 employee to vote in the 30 year history of NLRB representation elections. To commemorate this event, the Agency sponsored a variety of programs held in Washington and in its Regional Offices. The records documenting these ceremonies are described on the attached sheet.
