## 1. MARSHALL WILSON PHOTO COLLECTION OF THE NORRIS RESERVOIR

This series contains photographs that were taken by Marshall Wilson during 1933-36 in the period just before the Norris reservoir was filled. Mr. Wilson was a TVA employee who worked in the field interviewing and completing forms for families who were being relocated.
