Strip Mine Reclamation Case Files TVA owns mineral rights only in 148,653 acres of coal properties as follows: 52,914 acres in Tennessee. 89,610 acres in Kentucky, and 6,129 acres in Illinois. These reserves, totaling about 400 million tons, were acquired since 1960. It is expected that any mining of TVA coal reserves will be performed through private contractors. Each such case will be examined to determine what controls are necessary to obtain effective reclamation of the mined lands and otherwise protect the environment. The mining contracts will include provisions requiring the contractor to meet TVA's standards for restoration and protection. If State or Federal law then in existence provides for effective standards, TVA will require that the contractor fully meet the standards of the applicable law. Because three states (Alabama, Tennessee, and Virginia) in TVA's coal purchase area had not passed regulatory legislation, TVA in 1965 adopted the policy of including reclamation provisions in all subsequent contracts
