> The present retention requirement for investigative files is 20 years. The files in Accession 61A-200((Alpha Files 1928-6/30/59) would not be disposable as a block until 1980. However, the largest portion of records in this Accession would fall within the retention period and be disposable. Since the records do not have sufficient administrative value to the Commission, the cost of purging material eligible for destruction would not be justified. It is therefore requested that the whole of Accession 61A-200 be disposed immediately.

In our annual review of retention periods we will look at the feasibility of reducing the present retention period of 20 years on Investigative Case Files.
