1.	Kabinto Lists (4) A series of textual records; 4 lists of names members of the Navajo Tribe. In 1972, prior to the passage of the Relocation Act, P.L. 93-531, a group of individual members of the Navajo Tribe were evicted from the Hopi Reservation as consequence of the decision in U.S. v Kabinto, 456 F2d. 1987 (1972). These individuals were physically removed from the Hopi Reservation and, along with their livestock and personal possessions, taken window Rock on the Navajo Reservation and housed in tents. Fo lists of the names of these evicted individuals were eventual complied. The Relocation Act, P.L. 93-531, was amended by P.L. 9305in 1980, to include those individuals evicted as a result of Kabinias members of the Navajo Nation entitled to relocation assistant benefits. On November 14, 1983, The Navajo and Hopi India Relocation Commission (subsequently the O.N.H.I.R.) caused to be published in the Federal Register at Vol. 48, No. 220, the criteria und which a "Kabinto" applicant could be certified eligible for relocation assistance benefits, part of said eligibility criteria being the inclusion of the applicant's name on one of the 4 "Kabinto Lists," 25 CI 700.603(B)(1-4).
