The Commission to Promote Investment in America's Infrastructure  
Attachment to SF 115-109

In 1991, Congress created the Commission to Promote Investment in America's Infrastructure to study the feasibility and desirability of creating a system through which pension funds could safely be invested in the design and construction of infrastructure facilities in the United States. The Commission is bipartisan and is comprised of one presidential appointee, three Senate appointees, and three House appointees.

The Commission held seven public hearings in Washington, D. C., in order to assess America's infrastructure needs and develop alternate investment ideas. In addition, the Commission received numerous written submissions, held workshop sessions, and analyzed existing publications on infrastructure and pension funds.

The Commission issued its report to the President and Congress on February 23, 1993. It is expected that the Commission's recommendations will form the basis for legislative proposals in the area of infrastructure investment.
