## Description:

The National Commission on American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian Housing was established by public law 101-235 (103 Stat 2052), the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Reform Act, dated December 15, 1989. It was extended by the Housing and Community Act of 1992 (106 Stat 3711) to terminate on October 31, 1993. The commission submitted its final report to Congress and the Secretary of the Department of Housing and Urban Development in August 1992. A year later the commission issued a supplemental report and then ceased operations on August 31, 1993.

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National Commission on American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian Housing Attachment to 115-109

The National Commission on American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian Housing was established by Public Law 101-235, the Department of Housing and Urban Development Reform Act of 1989. The Commission is comprised of two members appointed by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, two members appointed by the Chairman and the Ranking Minority Member of the Select Committee on Indian Affairs of the Subcommittee on Housing and Community Development of the Committee on Banking, Finance, and Urban Affairs of the House of Representatives, three members appointed by the Chairman and Ranking Minority Member of the Subcommittee on Housing and Urban Affairs of the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs of the Senate, one Native Hawaiian appointed by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, and one Native Hawaiian appointed by the Chairman and Ranking Minority Member of the Select Committee on Indian Affairs of the Senate.

The Commission held public hearings and meetings across the Country to evaluate factors currently impeding the development of safe and affordable housing for Native Americans and to evaluate alternative strategies for the development, management, and modernization of housing for Native Americans. In August 1992, the Commission submitted its final report to Congress and the Secretary of the Department of Housing and Urban Development. The Commission submitted 34 recommendations based on testimony received in the hearings for fundamental changes in housing policy and statutory and regulatory changes to existing federal programs.

The Commission will release a supplemental report in August 1993. This report will contain additional recommendations and a description of the Commission's legislative initiative, which will be submitted to Congress as well. It is expected that the recommendations and proposed legislation will serve as a basis for improving Native American housing.
