
Description:

The President's Committee on Consumer Interests (PCCI) was established in the Executive Office of the President by Executive Order 11136 on January 3, 1964, as an advisory body consisting of both federal agency representatives and private citizens, with the the Consumer Advisory Council (CAC) designated the private-sector element. The Committee was amended by Executive Order 11349 of May 1, 1967. The PCCI was abolished by Executive Order 11583 on February 24, 1971 and many of the responsibilities of the Committee were transferred to the U.S. Office of Consumer Affairs, which was established by the same Executive Order 11583.

Johnson established the President's Committee on Consumer Interests by Executive Order #11136 on January 3, 1964. The Committee was amended by Executive Order #11349 of May 1, 1967. The Committee was established to encourage improved consumer participation, education and legislation on state and local levels; advocate consumer concerns to industry and business; promote consumer education programs; and make recommendations to the President on consumer policies and legislation. The President's Committee on Consumer Interests was abolished with Executive Order #11583 on February 24, 1971. Much of the responsibilities of the Committee were transferred to the U.S. Office of Consumer</p>
